Alzheimer's disease is a growing epidemic in the United States. With over 5 million Americans living with Alzheimer's and over 15 million providing unpaid care, it is evident that Memory Care Home Solutions has a unique national role to play in this burgeoning problem.

As a result of my testimony to the U.S. Senate Special Committee on Aging in January of 2017, Sarah Lenz Lock, Senior Vice President for Policy at AARP, asked Program Director Jill Cigliana and I to serve on the steering committee as members of the Provider Stakeholder Group for the first ever National Research Summit on Care Services and Support for Persons with Dementia and Their Caregivers. I am so honored to join an incredible group of speakers and look forward to sharing the highlights with you.

Our national recognition additionally led to our collaboration with dementia expert Laura Gitlin, PhD who heads the Center for Innovative Care in Aging at Johns Hopkins on a quality review of our program impact. Dr. Gitlin has published much of the evidence on which our program is modeled, and we are benefiting greatly from her thorough review and analysis of our work. We began drafting a manuscript with Dr. Gitlin with plans to submit to The Gerontological Society of America.

Our training programs, workshops and resources help more than 30,000 lives each year! We are so blessed to see the impact of our program firsthand. None of this could be accomplished without the incredible leadership at Memory Care Home Solutions. We are so excited to welcome four new board members this year.

This has been a big year for MCHS in terms of lives touched, national recognition and new leadership. We would not be able to offer our services free of charge if it weren't for the incredible support from our community, the myriad of partners and our growing recognition on a national scale. 

Program Growth 2016-2017

Thanks to our **generous donors**, Memory Care Home Solutions continues to flourish. Donations **enable our services** to expand with the growing population of those impacted by cognitive impairment.

In 2016, Memory Care Home Solutions experienced a 70% increase in Caregiver Training Consultation Visits and a 88% increase in people served through these visits. Additionally, there was an incredible 222% growth in the Memory Care Plus program. This allowed a significantly larger number of people to be served in 2016 than previous years.

Funding for Memory Care Plus was provided in part by the Retirement Research Foundation and The Missouri Foundation for Health.



Program Impact

Caregivers report an average of 10 weekly problematic dementia behaviors displayed by their loved ones. Problem behaviors include issues such as: wandering/pacing, waking family members at night, misplacing items, repetitive questions, resistance to bathing, failure to perform self-care, and hallucinations.

99% of caregivers report that MCHS helped them identify and address priorities and concerns about caregiving.

98% of caregivers report feeling more confident in their role.

95% of caregivers report reduced stress as a result of MCHS intervention.

Families implement 63% of dementia care and resource strategies recommended by MCHS within the first 6 months of service.

People with dementia experience **62%** fewer trips to the emergency department, **53%** fewer calls to 911, and **65%** fewer hospitalizations after participating in MCHS intervention.



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
