
PROGRAM SUMMARY

Memory Care Home Solutions provided free assistance to



Training & Consultation (CTC) program The staff educates several families about cognitive impairment signs and symptoms, provide personal and home safety devices, and equips caregivers with evidence-based strategies for improving communication, managing difficult behaviors, and reducing strain and stress in the household. Throughout the program's 12-month follow-up, staff continues to support these families through telephone counseling and resource referral.







JAMES & SHIRLEY'S STORY

We received a call from a concerned daughter-in-law, worried about the health of her father-in-law, James, who was caring for his wife, Shirley, who had recently been diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. The daughter-in-law described an all-too-familiar scenario: James looked tired and run-down, exhausted from dealing with challenging dementia behaviors and withdrawing from his usual routine of volunteering at church and attending family functions. Shirley demanded to drive, although she couldn't do so safely anymore; she made inappropriate comments to family members, which hurt their feelings. She also felt lost - aware of her diagnosis and fearful that her friends were avoiding her.

We were able to facilitate a family meeting with their blended family of 6 adult children, spouses, and grandchildren to provide education on dementia symptoms and to teach strategies for every family member to support James while also engaging Shirley. We introduced some formal support so James can get out and nourish his spirit at church functions and Shirley has transportation to fun events with her friends. We worked with Shirley's doctor and family to transition her through driving retirement issues. Most of all, we planned strategies for family celebrations so Shirley didn't get overwhelmed or agitated, yet they could all still enjoy special times together. We are honored to support families in the amazing endeavor of extending and improving time at home for a loved one with dementia!

We are thrilled to have enrolled 15% more families this year in our most comprehensive and effective program, In-home Caregiver Training and Consultation. In this program, families receive an average of 10 hours of clinical support to implement individualized strategies and changes to help the person with dementia and decrease stress for the family. This is our core program which helps to improve health and extend quality time at home. We targeted our community outreach carefully so that we could serve more families this year.





STATE FUNDING

Memory Care Home Solutions' staff and volunteers lobbied in Jefferson City for inclusion in the Missouri State Budget. By sharing stories of client's positively impacted through home-based services, Missouri Legislators view Memory Care Home Solutions as vital to linking hospital systems to community-based health - medically trained healthcare providers to family caregivers - thus reducing systemic and institutional healthcare costs, and elevating wellness and health literacy throughout the St. Louis metro area. Memory Care Home Solutions secured \$50,000 through the Department of Health and Human Services in the 2013 state budget year, of which \$25,000 will be disbursed this summer.

CORPORATE PARTNERSHIPS Reinsurance Group of America, Watlow Electric, Express Scripts, Ameren, Covidien, Forest

Industries and Elan Pharmaceuticals provided substantial funding during the program year. Memory Care Home Solutions looks forward to focusing on expanded corporate and pharmaceutical donations.

GRANTS 90% of grant funds are annually requested gifts from the funders of the same amounts. 10% represents new or expanded donor sources. Grants funding is achieved from local, regional and national funders.




Ellen and John Wallace
